Dog Social

- TRULY appreciates the company of almost every other dog
- Most Puppies start here
- Enjoys and seeks out other dogs; tolerates or encourages rude behaviors from other dogs (humping or barking in their face)
- With maturity, nearly all will
 move to the right of this trait
- Quite rare in Adult Dogs
- Unfortunately, we expect all dogs to exhibit this trait, even though it's fairly abnormal in most mature dogs

Dog Tolerant

- Gets along with most other dogs.
- May be playful or neutral
- Generally has a pretty long fuse and good communication skills
- Tends to do well on leash around other dogs
- Require normal supervision and limited direction from humans
- Puppies who grow up to become Dog Selective or Dog Aggressive may start here
- A very common place for adult dogs to end up after maturity

Dog Selective

- Has a small circle of "approved" dogs or types of dog
- Scuffles may break out quickly
- Often has very short fuse (less tolerant)
- May dislike certain play styles or types of dog on sight
- Less than stellar on leash with other dogs.
- May seem like the "fun police" or "instigator" in group situations
- Requires a lot of supervision and positive direction from humans
- Rare, concerning in well-socialized puppies with ONLY good dogdog experiences
- Very normal for an adult dog at maturity

Dog Aggressive

- Has a very limited circle of dog friends
- Perhaps only one or two housemate dogs
- May have no dog friends at all
- Very poor social skills
- Quick to spark up on leash
- May appear social, then change when close
- Needs skilled, knowledgeable support, patience, and direction from humans to succeed in dog-dog interactions
- Highly abnormal in pupples
- Fairly uncommon in adult dogs who have no history of bad encounters
